The coaching sessions were designed to be interactive and engaging, employing a variety of teaching methods to ensure effective learning. These included detailed lectures, collaborative group discussions, practical exercises and case studies. The lectures were structured to cover the theoretical aspects of teaching and research aptitude, while the interactive discussions allowed students

to deepen their understanding through peer exchange. Practical exercises, including mock tests, helped familiarize students with the exam format, allowing them to manage their time effectively and test their knowledge in a simulated environment. One of the key features of the coaching program was the opportunity for students to clarify any doubts regarding the exam and its preparation. A total of 42 students (13 males, 29 females) from M.Com Part II participated in the coaching sessions. The sessions were well-received, and students actively engaged in discussions and exercises.

### **Expected Outcomes of the Activity**

It was expected that by the end of the program, students would acquire a comprehensive understanding of the core concepts of Paper-I, including teaching methods, research aptitude, and the overall structure of the UGC-NET exam. Through mock tests, practical exercises, and time-management techniques, it was anticipated that students would develop effective exam strategies. This would include mastering the art of answering multiple-choice questions, managing time during the exam, and using critical thinking skills to tackle complex questions. The ultimate goal of the program was to ensure that all participants were well-prepared to successfully attempt the UGC-NET exam.

### Certificate Course in Business Accounting with Tally Prime

### 7th to 28th January 2025



The Certificate Course Committee and the Department of Commerce & Management organized a 30-hour Certificate Course on 'Business Accounting with Tally Prime' for Third Year B.Com students. The sessions were conducted from 7th January to 28th January 2025 between 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM in Lab Nos. 2, 3, and 5. The resource persons for the course were Mr. William Vaz, Proprietor, Comtech Academy, trainers Ms. Bhoomika Gaude, and Ms. Manisha Jalmi from Comtech Academy.

The objective of the course was to provide in-depth knowledge of key accounting concepts, inventory management, and GST-related processes. It focused on advanced techniques in accounting and inventory management, including GST returns filing, stock management, and various modes of voucher entry, covering even some of the niche features of Tally. The course also included practical aspects of invoicing and other essential accounting procedures.

To facilitate learning, the college provided lab access, ensuring that students without personal laptops could conveniently practice and apply their skills. Throughout the course, students received hands-on practical exposure to the following topics:

- ➤ Introduction to Tally Accounting: Groups, Ledgers, Vouchers, Creating New Voucher Types; Inventory/Stock Management including Groups, Categories, Units of Measure, Godown, Items, and Inventory Vouchers; Different Modes of Voucher Entry; and Invoicing.
- ➤ **GST in Tally:** GSTR-I, GSTR-II transactions, GST Reports, Online Returns Filing, and Transactions Recording up to Finalization.
- **Advanced Corporate Level Module:** 
  - Bill-wise Details, Import/Export of Data, Backup & Restore, Bank Reconciliation, Cheque Printing,
     Budgets, Re-Order Level, Zero Valued Entries, POS Invoice.
  - Order Processing, Batch-wise Details, Price Lists, and TDS.
- ➤ Additional Features: Shortcut Keys, Security, Printing in Tally, Configuring Tally, and Splitting Data Based on Financial Years.

At the end of the course, students answered an examination consisting of a Practical Exam (75 marks) and a Theory Exam (25 marks). All 71 students successfully completed the course and were awarded certificates. The teacher in charge for the Certificate Course was Asst. Prof. Sheryl Sanches.

She began the session by sharing her personal journey and professional experiences,

emphasizing that financial independence is not just about earning but also about managing finances wisely to ensure long-term stability.

The discussion then transitioned into the realm of life and health insurance, where Ms. Lawande elaborated on the various types of insurance policies and their benefits, and how insurance contributes to financial security for individuals and families. ### Field Trip cum Industry Interaction Programme

The group departed from the college at 9:00 AM via a bus arranged for the students. Faculty members, Asst. Prof. Valencia Baptista and Asst. Prof. Edrea Picardo, accompanied the students. The festival, organized by the Directorate of Fisheries, Government of Goa, was held at the Open Field Ground, SAG Campal, Panaji, Goa, from 10th to 12th January 2025.

The students attended an interactive seminar on "Seafood Products and By-Products," conducted by Dr. Girija Saurabh Behere, Assistant Professor, College of Fisheries, Rani Laxmibai University, Madhya Pradesh. The seminar was divided into two sessions:

### 22nd to 24th January 2025

The Young Researchers Conference and Workshop, organized by the Humanities and Social Sciences Research Forum, BITS Pilani, K.K. Birla Campus, served interdisciplinary academic platform for scholars in the humanities and social sciences. Held over three days from 22nd to 24th January 2025, the event provided

### Session on "Consumer Rights and Consumer Protection Act 2019"

## 27th January 2025



The Consumer Welfare Cell of Vidya Vikas Mandal's Shree Damodar College of Commerce & Economics organized a Consumer Awareness Session on "Consumer Rights and Consumer Protection Act 2019" on 27th January 2025, from 12:00 Noon to 1:00 PM in the Smart Classroom. The session was open to students across all programs and witnessed enthusiastic participation from 62 students (25 males, 37 females).

The session was conducted by Mr. Roland Martins, Coordinator of GOACAN (Goa Civic and Consumer Action Network), a prominent organization advocating consumer rights in Goa. The primary objective was to educate students about their rights and responsibilities as consumers and the mechanisms available for grievance redressal. Mr. Martins provided an engaging explanation of fundamental consumer rights through the Consumer Protection Act 2019, procedures for filing complaints in consumer courts, and the role of Consumer Protection Councils. He also discussed online grievance redressal mechanisms available to citizens.

To enhance understanding, Mr. Martins shared real-life case studies highlighting unfair trade practices, defective products, and unethical advertisements. He explained how consumers sought justice under consumer protection laws. Additionally, Mr. Martins offered practical tips for responsible consumer behavior, such as:

- Checking expiry dates, product labels, and MRP before purchase.
- Preserving purchase receipts and bills for future reference.
- Avoiding impulsive purchases and staying vigilant about misleading advertisements.
- Utilizing digital platforms and apps for lodging complaints.

The session concluded with an interactive Q&A segment where students sought clarifications on various aspects of consumer rights and shared their concerns about real-life consumer disputes. The teacher coordinators for the program were Ms. Girija Gaonkar and Ms. Vinaya Kirloskar, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science, and member of the Consumer Welfare Cell. The activity was organized under the guidance of Asst. Prof. Pooja Shanbhag, Convenor of the Consumer Welfare Cell.

By participating in this session, students gained comprehensive knowledge about their rights under the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, and understood their significance in everyday transactions, making them more responsible
